- Union of the Crowns, and beginnings of more peaceful times.
- Union of the Parliaments and closer trade and cooperation.
- Innovations in transport, the Industrial and Agricultural Revolutions.
- Castles, bastles, pele towers fortified buildings and walled towns.
- Politics- not the modern party stuff rather the ancient seats of power.
- The Border itself where and why, and glitches along the route.
